EDUCATOR'S GUIDE

Submarines: Life Underwater

Preparation

Overview and Objectives

This lesson is geared toward students in grades K-5.

The submarine USS Growler (SSG-577) was commissioned on August 30, 1958 and decommissioned on May 25, 1964. *Growler* was a guided missile submarine capable of launching and

guiding the Regulus I nuclear missile. This program discusses what it was like to live on a submarine.

This lesson includes a <u>slideshow</u> in which an instructor can lead participants through an exploration of life on a submarine. The lesson culminates with participants creating a journal entry as if they were a *Growler* crew member.

Instructional Modalities

This activity was designed for both synchronous or asynchronous instruction.

For **synchronous instruction**, we recommend a platform that allows both for whole class discussion and for students to interact in small groups.

For **asynchronous adaptations**, we provide suggestions for teachers to provide additional support for the activities and for students to share their work with each other.

Materials

- Submarines: Life Underwater Slideshow
- Activity Sheets
- Paper
- Writing Utensils



Lesson

1. Introductory Activity

- Ask Participants::
 - O What is a submarine?
 - o What can submarines do that makes them special?
 - o Discuss the responses with the group.

2. Core Activity

- Share <u>video</u> of the submarine *Growler* and discuss the job of the submarine.
 - O Growler had to stay underwater for a long period of time. What might that mean for the people living and working on the submarine?
- Ask participants if they ever had to stay in one place for a long period of time. Have them share what was difficult about that process
- Share two videos on water and sanitation and sleeping arrangements of *Growler*. Have participants share what challenges submariners on *Growler* might face.
 - o What might be frustrating for a submariner on Growler?
 - What could be some solutions to some of the challenges they face?
 - o What are some things you like to do when faced with a challenge?
 - o Share an experience where you had to compromise.
- Review how submariners relax on the submarine Growler.
 - Why is having time to relax important in a place like *Growler*?
 - O What are some things you do to relax?
- Have participants create a journal imagining that they are part of the Growler crew. In their journal entry, they should share a story involving some issues they may have living in a shared space like Growler. In your story, include a solution to that problem. Once participants finish their journal entries, have them share out.
 - o What problems did you face in your journal entry?



- o What were some solutions to those problems?
- How could we apply these solutions to situations in our everyday lives?

<u>Asynchronous Adaptation</u>

Have participants go through the <u>slideshow</u> on their own. Using their <u>activity sheet</u>, participants can respond to questions about life on *Growler* and write journal entries as *Growler* crewmembers. Have participants share their journal entries using Flipgrid.

Extension Activities

To deepen student engagement with this content, you may choose to add the following activities:

Compare Growler to Intrepid

Have participants compare what life may have been like living in a submarine like *Growler* versus an aircraft carrier like *Intrepid*. Participants can explore this <u>virtual exhibition</u> to learn more about *Intrepid* and write a journal entry from the perspective of an *Intrepid* crewmember

Keep a Journal for a Week

Have participants write in a journal every day for a week and identify different problems they faced and share how they solved those problems. Participants can then meet with a peer and share one or two problems and discuss alternative ways to address them.
